## Teacher Education Division

### **Master of Education in Foreign Language Education (145/MFLG)**

This program is appropriate for teachers with Elementary or Secondary certification with a teaching major in an approved foreign language (French, German, Italian, Russian, or Spanish). This program provides advanced training in foreign and second language teaching methodology, linguistics, and culture.

To be considered for the Master of Education program in Foreign Language, applicants must present evidence of:

1. Eligibility for a Michigan teaching certificate;
2. An undergraduate major or equivalent coursework in an approved foreign language; and
3. An overall honor point average of 2.6 or higher.

Admission to the Master of Education program is contingent upon admission to the graduate school. Applications for the Master of Education Degree area are available in the Academic Services Division, Room 489 Education.

### **Student Responsibilities**

#### **Plan of Work**

After you have been admitted to the Master of Education program, you should meet with a foreign language education advisor to complete your Plan of Work. Your Plan of Work must be submitted to the Graduate Education Office for approval, prior to completion of 12 semester hours of graduate coursework.

#### **Coursework**

Advanced planning will help ensure the completion of your program in a timely fashion. Information about course offerings can be obtained from the Foreign Language Education Department.

#### **Time Limitations**

You must complete the requirements for the Master of Education within six years following the completion of the first recorded graduate course to be used toward your degree.

#### **Master's Degree Seminars**

You should plan to complete the Introductory Master's Seminar (TED 7000) at least one year before enrolling in the Terminal Master's Seminar (ED 7999). Students are advised to take TED 7000 after they have completed 8-10 hours of coursework.

#### **Transfer Credits**

A maximum of six graduate semester credits from another accredited university may be transferred and applied to your program provided the courses are approved by your advisor and the College of Education Academic Services Division. Such courses must be graduate level courses with grades of "B" or better. However, a minimum of 24 semester credits toward the master's degree must be earned in residence at Wayne State University.

#### **Graduation**

You must submit an application to graduate. Your application must be submitted to the Central Records Office, 1 West HNJ Student Services Center, no later than the first day of classes for the semester in which you will complete your degree requirements.
